The Use of Pharmacy Vouchers to Expand Injection Drug Users' Access to Sterile Needles/Syringes: Experience from a Cross-Border HIV Prevention Project in Vietnam and China



Background of the Cross-Border Project

Cross-Border movement

- ■Drug Trans-shipment Routes \rightarrow Heroin Use \rightarrow Heroin Injection \rightarrow HIV Transmission \rightarrow Increasing HIV Prevalence \rightarrow Cross-Border Transmission (Molecular epidemiology: Beyrer et al., *AIDS*, 2000)
- ■Small-scale movement across long, porous border
- ■Trade, migratory employment, "floating population"
- ■Intermarriage, ethnic minority groups on both sides.

Geographic Setting



Interventions

- Peer-based education of Injecting Drug Users (IDUs), sex workers, and sexual partners of IDUs.
- Distribution of needles/syringes and condoms directly and through redemption of vouchers at participating pharmacies.
- Collection/safe disposal of used needles/syringes.
- Community education.

Full implementation of IDU interventions began in 2002.

This presentation will focus on the pharmacy voucher component of the IDU interventions and will highlight marketing and behavior change communication (BCC).

Pharmacy Vouchers


- Pharmacies involved in the voucher scheme should be convenient for IDUs in terms of opening time (from 7AM to 7 PM); location; willingness of pharmacy operators to serve IDUs.
- Each voucher has value of 1,500 VND (16,000 VND = 1 USD) and is redeemable for 1 syringe/needle + 1 ampoule of water or 1 condom.
- In order to offer IDUs multiple choices, we distribute pharmacy vouchers (PV) as well as directly distribute new needles/syringes.
- PV has some advantages such as: they are easy to keep in the pocket, they can be exchanged when the IDU needs supplies; they may help avoid stigma against IDU... but PV also have some disadvantages: depend on opening time and convenient location of pharmacies; PV may also be damaged or lost.

Pharmacy Vouchers (Continues)

- In the context of reducing harm related to drug injection, the BCC aspect plays very important role because it helps people to practice safer behaviors
- Outreach peer educator is assigned to meet IDU in the community to provide knowledge on HIV/AIDS and also offer them safer materials for their practice, so this could help them reach IDUs more frequently.
- Broader advocacy targeted to local authorities and communities to improve social acceptance of the intervention program and to seek consensus

Pharmacy vouchers and BCC for HIV prevention

- Vouchers include HIV prevention messages (see next slide).
- Vouchers are distributed by peer educators along with other oral and printed HIV risk reduction information, including brochures.
- Vouchers, as well as direct distribution of syringes, are used to put into practice the risk reduction messages being delivered, including IDUs having a sufficient supply of sterile injection equipment and using a sterile needle/syringe, or at least his/her own needle/syringe for each injection.



Pharmacy voucher component: Implementation issues


- Importance of identifying pharmacies that are conveniently located for IDUs to access and that treat IDUs with respect.
- In Vietnam, IDUs like both vouchers and direct distribution (previous slide); vouchers are most popular in sites where participating pharmacies are convenient and considered safe. Some pharmacies have been replaced with more convenient ones.
- In China, IDUs initially accepted vouchers, perhaps as a novelty, but fairly quickly came to prefer direct distribution, probably because they considered it simpler and more convenient. Very few vouchers now used in China (previous slide).
- In Vietnam, some problems with fraud some peer educators selling vouchers directly to pharmacies. Several peer educators and pharmacies were removed from the project.

HIV Prevalence among IDUs




HIV Incidence Among New Injectors



Conclusions and Lessons Learned

- This is an innovative project, offering important opportunities to control a cross-border HIV epidemic and increase cross-border collaboration.
- The interventions are reaching substantial proportions of IDUs and providing public health benefits.
- HIV prevalence among IDUs is stable or declining and HIV incidence among new injectors is coming down since their behaviors may change to have practice more safer injection and sex.
- Pharmacy vouchers represent an important component of the project, especially in Vietnam.
- It is important to provide IDUs with multiple and flexible ways to access sterile injection equipment. However, pharmacy vouchers may not be acceptable to IDUs everywhere.
- Careful and regular monitoring is critical to prevent fraud of the voucher scheme.
