This means that we combine a focus on disease-specific or categorical health conditions (vertical approach) with committed efforts to address systemic flaws or gaps in the wider healthcare delivery structure (horizontal approach). Applying this integrated approach to service delivery, Abt Associates focuses on:

- systematic quality improvement, supervision, monitoring and accountability;
- increased coverage and utilization of health care services;
- planning, management and human resources;
- resource distribution, financing, and pharmaceutical supply;
- information sharing, coordination and referral systems; and
- community engagement and mobilization.

SELECTED HIGHLIGHTS OF ABT ASSOCIATES AT WORK

Improving Child Health and Nutrition in Zambia

In Zambia, Abt Associates has improved the quality of child health and nutrition care by introducing community and facility-based IMCI in

all 72 districts in the country, with over 500 health workers trained in IMCI case management. In addition, Abt supported the Ministry of Health to develop Zambia's Essential Nutrition Package and provide 7.8 million children with Vitamin A supplements - resulting in an increase in coverage from 67% in 2005 to 90% coverage in 2008.

Local Solutions to Build Local Capacity

Abt has also introduced the concept of "Clinical Care Specialists," positioned in Provincial Health Offices across Zambia to improve clinical management of HIV/AIDS and other significant health issues. Serving as advisors, mentors, and trainers, Clinical Care Specialists play a critical role in each of Zambia's nine provinces. They have trained hundreds of health workers, have helped improve ART access for hundreds of thousands of new patients, and provide constant supervision, case management and review support, leading to continuous improvement in quality of care given at the facility level.

Improving Quality of Care in Kyrgyzstan

Abt introduced a continuous quality improvement (CQI) program designed to improve the diagnosis and clinical management of hypertension. Beginning in 2005, the project trained primary care

providers on evidence-based clinical practice guidelines for management of hypertension, and district CQI coordinators to support and monitor the program. Results have been impressive with a significant increase in routine screenings and hypertension being managed better by doctors and patients. Doctors are now able to prescribe more appropriate and effective drugs, as recommended in the new guideline. These improvements have reduced average systolic and diastolic blood pressures by 23.3 and 8.3, respectively, bringing the majority of patients closer to a healthy blood pressure range after only six months.

An Innovative Model for Hospital-Based Safe Motherhood

Abt's ZdravPlus project has supported the Kyrgyz Ministry of Health to introduce a comprehensive Safe Motherhood program in maternal hospitals using evidence-based guidelines and hands-on clinical training. As a result, there has been a substantial improvement in the

provision of prenatal, obstetric, and postnatal care in accordance with accepted guidelines. The number of vaginal deliveries without intervention has increased, fewer neonates have been admitted unnecessarily to the ICU, the third stage of labor has been actively managed in nearly 90% of all deliveries, and postpartum hemorrhage rates have declined.

Enhancing Maternal Health and Family Planning in Jordan

In Jordan, Abt is improving community outreach and counseling efforts, reaching more than 778,800 women. As a result of Abt's efforts, 81,148 women have adopted modern methods of family planning, and a majority of referrals (64% of family planning clients and 59% of breast cancer clients) from outreach efforts have resulted in follow-up visits to health clinics. Abt has introduced Safe Motherhood Committees in government hospitals as an innovative way to improve quality of care in Jordan, and is training both public and private sector maternal and child health service providers in improved service delivery and counseling. Among the key results of family planning activities is enhanced capacity to perform intrauterine device (IUD) insertions, which has increased from 29% to 42% in maternal and child health units.
