











## E-Learning

### in Nigeria

- 2006: Learning about Living Nigeria
- E-learning programme taught 120,000 young in over 500 schools in 22 states
- Over 1 million questions received from 400,000 young people via the mobile Q&A platform

## Learning about Living is...

#### one world

## in Senegal

- E-learning platform developed with local partners in French & Wolof
- 50 schools and training centres in 7 of 14 regions
- Over 300,000 questions
- Radio in all regions and local languages
- Collaborative network for sustainability







### Learning about Living is...

#### one world

### in Mali

- Part of "My Rights, My Voice" youth empowerment programme
- 18 lessons developed in French and Bambara
- E-learning platform piloted in 2 regions with 4,000 youth
- Platform being adapted for blind and deaf students
- Radio programmes broadcast daily via Projet Jeunes







### **Our Belief**

- Accurate, confidential, non-judgmental information
- Safe spaces to learn about sensitive topic and ask questions
- Meet youth where they are already gathering and speak their language
- Technology adds value

## Challenges

- Use data to increase the impact of the project -
- Sustainability of the project depends on multisectorial collaboration (Officials, operators, civil society...) and from the pilote to scale up
- Costs of services- social responsibility of operators
- More sharing experiences/debate/meetings with Mhealth partners in francophone/west Africa area
- Tech4dev or Dev4tech?
